- 16-25 March 2018 (10 days)
- Participants: more than 260 local, Mainland and overseas organisations (including 103 exhibitors)
- Attendance: over 720 000









- Among the exhibits were landscaped gardens, floral displays, potted plants and bonsai.
- Activities included horticultural talks, floral arrangement demonstrations, cultural performances, plant exhibit competition, drawing competition, photo competition, green stall games, workshops, guided tours and parent-child fun games.
